
#### **Underlying Conditions That Inform Our Work**

- Poverty transcends a lack of income
- Systemic Racism

#### Social Determinants of Health

#### What are social determinants of health?

Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) are the conditions in the environments where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning and quality-of-life outcomes and risks.



### **Status Report Review**

#### **Grant Agreement**

- Grant period = 12 months
- Final Status Report due by May 31, 2025
  - Mid-year reports are now phone calls
- Unexpended grant funds: Notify us ASAP!
- Keep us informed of staff & program changes
- MMF must review grant-related communication that names the Fund prior to publication
- Status report must be complete before applying again


